Members of the Public. At 6:40 PM, Gregg Cowdery reported there were 84 people present.

Call to Order: Call to Order by Andy Domenigoni at 6:32 PM.

Flag Salute. Introductions.

Andy proposed to revise the agenda, placing Sheriff after approval of minutes, due to a call.

Approval of revised Agenda:

Motion-to-approve by Sheldrake; second by Long. Approved unanimously.

Approval of Meeting Minutes from March 10, 2022:

Motion-to-approve by Long; second by Sheldrake. Approved unanimously.

Sheriff Department update; Deputy Pendleton:

- · Crime stats: March had 369 calls & 11 arrests (variety). Gas theft at U-Haul. Burglary at gas/liquor store. There was a shooting in the Homeland/Green Acres area; 74 & Juniper Flats Rd.
- · A citizen noted there's a new pop-up dispensary operating. The sheriff will look into this.

Presentation: Draft Environmental Impact Report – Winchester Community Plan & General Plan Amendment #1207. Presented by John Hildebrand, Riverside County Planning Director.

- Robyn Brock, Deputy Chief of Staff for Riverside County Third District Supervisor, Chuck Washington, introduced John Hildebrand.
- Mr. Hildebrand presented a PowerPoint presentation on the status of the Winchester Community Plan & General Plan Amendment #1207. He stated that the presentation will be made available at a later date (on the Web).
- This "Foundation Change" was set in motion back in 2016 by the Board of Supervisors. Locally, in Winchester, several Workshops were held, wherein local citizens were invited to participate and provide input on many things, including land use, housing, transportation, identity, character, and more.
- · A new Winchester Policy Area was created. Changes to Land Use Designations are under consideration, along with design guidelines for certain areas, etc.
- · After the proposed amended plan has been adopted, there will be a Zoning Consistency Plan. Other key elements were mentioned, and Hildebrand shared various graphics. He noted that there are three separate Area Plans: Sun City / Menifee, Winchester, and the Southwest Area Plan.
- Downtown is about 652 acres (a little over a mile square). Winchester: 22,000 acres (about 35 sq. miles). The Hwy 79 Planning Area covers about 50,000 acres.
- He showed the Winchester Policy Area (map). Bounded generally by Stetson, Briggs, Scott & Hidden Valley.
- A "Foundation Change" is a set of major changes to the General Plan. He showed a map of changes proposed to land use, which would allow higher density on certain parcels. He cautioned that these are only changes in Land Use designation, not Zone Changes. Later, there will be a Zoning Consistency Plan. Some rural areas will bump up to higher densities.
- The current General Plan identifies nine separate neighborhoods. The new GP will have the neighborhoods and the Downtown area. There will be Design Guidelines for the Downtown, to help assure design consistency.

- · Current policy restricts development by 9% of what it could have been. This policy will be amended, to remove the restriction, and to allow development to advance. Yet there will be a focus on infrastructure improvements, especially transportation. Perhaps even a transit station.
- The County is presently finalizing the EIR, and looking to release the EIR soon.
- · Q: Where will the EIR be for review? A: On the Web.
- Q: For projects that had been cut back by 9%; will those go back to the original counts? A: No. Must submit back into the County for consideration under current requirements. The state is asking the county to do certain things.
- Q: For projects that lost the 9%, would they be charged for that? A: Case-by-case.
- Q: Is there a set of Draft Design Guidelines that it available for the LUC to review? A: Not yet; soon, though.
- Q: Could you be more specific as to the schedule? A: Expect the Draft EIR to be completed in a few weeks. Then a few more weeks. The County now puts out a newsletter with updates of interest. Planning.RCTLMA.org
- · Various public noticing requirements will apply, and must be filed. There will be a 45-day comment period.
- Q: What's the timing? When will we have to get out of our houses? A: No one is being kicked out of their home. This is an amendment to the General Plan (her home is slated to become a park, it seems).
- Q: What percentage of the land will be affected by changes in density? A: Well, they hope to meet county-wide numbers required.
- · Peter Minegar, an environmental consultant, discussed the Housing Element. They did not change housing zones.
- Q: Will the Sierra Club, etc., challenge the changes to the GP? A: One can never tell who may litigate.
- Each year, the state asks area to meet expectations. Ever in flux.
- Q (Little): Is there a possibility of a citizen providing input into what is allowed in a given zone? A: A General Plan is a broad-brush set of guidelines; doesn't get into changing what might be in a particular zone. See Ord. 348.
- · Exercises in many charrettes that were held covered the topic a bit, as we mused about what might be downtown.
- Q (C.D.): We had discussed with Jerry Jolliffe the possibility of Density Transfers to encourage certain development; we're still interested in that. A: Density transfers involve exchanging one density value for another. Perhaps higher density for affordable housing units in exchange for more open space in a different area.
- Q: Any news on the realignment of SH 79? Q: All that is currently available is on-line. No funding at present.
- Q: Changes in density? A: In some zones, yes. Varies.
- Q: Transportation? A: The General Plan amendment will address transportation. How to move people in denser areas? Under consideration is a Park & Ride, possible Transit Station, of course highways, SH 79, & more.
- · C: Concerns about off ramps into town from SH 79. Also would like to see specific plans for transportation improvements before houses are built (not after).
- Q: More hospitals, ahead of houses? A: Medical is a private endeavor. They'll be looking for rooftops.
- The General Plan identifies thoroughfares in general. Development will affect the specifics, case-by-case.
- · To stay tuned in, Hildebrand encouraged all to subscribe to the newsletter. Visit the County Website to do so.
- · All present thanked Mr. Hildebrand for this update.

 - Regarding Hwy 79: She sits on the board. We are a 'shortcut to the desert.' "It's a matter of funding." Warren Road was to be a 6-lane divided highway at one time; now knocked down to just four lanes, undivided.
 - · A LAFCO Municipal Services Review is on the City of Hemet website. A draft by LAFCO suggests that Menifee expand their sphere of influence, east to SH 79. Read up! Voice your opinion! Petition in rear tonight.
